## Santa Barbara's Multimedia Adult/Slash Slumber Party February 7-9, 1997


Escapade is a three-day convention that begins with Registration on Friday morning at 9:00 a.m. and Programming that begins at noon and runs through Sunday evening. We enjoy a relaxed atmosphere with (occasionally!) sunny Southern California weather, lots of parties and Escapade margaritas, panels, Saturday night entertainment and songvid showings, full breakfast buffet on Sunday morning, art show and auction, and more. Our goal is to give you the kind of convention you want; offer suggestions when you register!

**Our convention hotel,** the Santa Barbara Holiday Inn, is located in Goleta (6 miles north of downtown Santa Barbara and 1 mile from the Santa Barbara airport). It is conveniently near local restaurants and shops, more than a dozen within three blocks.

#### **CONVENTION OVERVIEW**

#### **PANELS**

We have 32 hours of scheduled panels, more than any other year, ever. There are **thirteen** panels dedicated to specific fandoms, from Forever Knight to Wiseguy, to Space: Above & Beyond to Pros, to Due South, Babylon 5 and more. We hope you'll find *your* favorites on this list. **Eight** "media" panels are dedicated to characters and fan fiction, like "Character Bisexuality: Convenient Fiction or Character Trait?" and "Cross-Class & Cross-Species Relationships". Take a look at the pocket program for more details.

We have **ten** hours of panels about fan culture and community. We're taking a look at *ourselves*, how we work (or not) together as fans, what we think, and what we think others think. The goal of these panels is to open the floor for how fan culture is changing, what is good and bad about that, new technology and its effects on the community, and "traditional" vs. "nontraditional" approaches to the culture. We hope you'll all join us in making these panels informative and representative of the many, many different points of view out there. We're planning to tape and transcribe the Fandom 2000 seminar. Details will be announced in the panels.

#### **PARTIES & TOURS**

The **ESCAPADE** party is on Friday night in the consuite, with music, complimentary snacks, wine and ESCAPADE margaritas! It will be followed by the late-night "bedtime story reading". **VIRGULE '96** party: Saturday after Songvids in Deejay his room, with complimentary "sex in the rain" and the promise of a good time for all. A **Wild, Wild West** (room) party: scheduled for Saturday night after Songvids. Also, late on Saturday (11:00 p.m.), Cousing and Mary and Mary and Novite everyone to their room for **Highlander** & **Forever Knight**. Doubtless there will be several other announced parties that we don't know about yet; check the consuite's white board for more info!

Various TV shows in **the "Wide World of Media."** The hotel will be airing several different prime-time media shows on its BIG-SCREEN TV in the bar, including: X-Files, ST: Voyager, Space: Above & Beyond, Highlander and Babylon 5. Get together with your friends and turn the show into a big-screen party! See schedules in the consuite.

We have also planned an **off-site trip Monday** for those of you who are interested; we'll use the hotel's van and as many other cars as necessary to see downtown Santa Barbara, Stearns Wharf and the Santa Barbara Winery. Enjoy!

#### Consuite

The Con Suite is open from 9 a.m. to midnight, offering coffee & tea, snacks, sodas and an opportunity to meet and visit with other convention attendees. Say 'hello' to our Consuite Manager Melissa and her lovely assistant, Monique. Consider the consuite a constantly running mixer and information center, and make yourselves at home.


#### **ART SHOW**

Guidelines: Please, no food, drink, cameras or camcorders, and don't fondle the art until after you've bought it. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, and two bids will send a piece to auction. Make sure your bid is more than the previous one, or if you're the first bidder that it is at least as much as the minimum bid. Your bid is a commitment to buy the piece at that price if no one outbids you; you may not cross it out once written. Please keep track of how much you've committed yourself to spending.
